U.S. shoots down second unidentified object, over Alaska: Pentagon official

Pentagon spokesman John Kirby confirmed the shoot down in a press conference

The Pentagon took down an unidentified object Friday over Alaska, a Pentagon official said from the White House.

Pentagon spokesman John Kirby confirmed the shoot down in a press conference.

A U.S. official said there was “no affirmative indications of military threat,” according to the [New York Times](#).

As of now, officials have said that they can't confirm whether there was surveillance equipment on the object.

It has also not been confirmed that the object is a balloon, although that is what is speculated.

A U.S. official noted that the object had been traveling at an altitude that made it a possible threat to civilian aircraft.

U.S. forces shoot down 'unidentified object' over Canada airspace

The incident marks the third time in eight days the U.S. has shot down an object over North America.

U.S. forces on Saturday shot down an "unidentified object" over Canadian airspace, Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said Saturday.

The prime minister made the announcement via Twitter amid reports circulating of another airborne object floating over Canada.

"I ordered the take down of an unidentified object that violated Canadian airspace," he said, "[NORAD] shot down the object over the Yukon."

"Canadian and U.S. aircraft were scrambled, and a U.S. F-22 successfully fired at the object," he also said.

Canadian Defense Minister Anita Anand said at a press conference later the takedown of the "small cylindrical object" was a "joint effort" with aircraft from Canada.

"This was a NORAD mission," she said.

The White House also issued a statement, saying, "Earlier today, President Biden spoke with Prime Minister Trudeau on the unidentified, unmanned object in North American air space. The object was closely tracked and monitored by North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) over the last 24 hours and the president has been continually briefed by his national security team since the object was detected."

A NORAD spokesman had earlier [confirmed to Canada's CTV News](#) that "military aircraft are currently operating from Alaska and Canada in support of North

American Aerospace Defense Command activities" and that the joint initiative has "positively identified a high-altitude airborne object over northern Canada."

"While we cannot discuss specifics related to these activities at this time, please note that NORAD conducts sustained, dispersed operations in the defense of North America through one or all three NORAD regions," the organization said to the news network.

The object being spotted Saturday follows a U.S. Air Force fighter jet on Feb. 4 shooting down a Chinese surveillance balloon off the South Carolina coast, after the vessel traversed the country, in a path over several military installations.

The Pentagon said Friday that a small, unidentified object had been shot down over Alaska, as ordered by President Biden.

US military shoots down another suspicious object over Lake Huron, officials say

The latest high-altitude object was shot down over Lake Huron officials said.

The U.S. military shot down another suspicious object on Sunday, marking the fourth object to be shot down by U.S. forces over North America in just over a week.

The latest high-altitude object was shot down over Lake Huron, officials said.

U.S. forces downed the object Sunday afternoon after the Federal Aviation Administration [issued](#) a "national defense airspace" temporary flight restriction Sunday afternoon over part of Lake Michigan. The restriction was [removed](#) after several hours.

"US military has decommissioned another 'object' over Lake Huron," Michigan Rep. [Jack Bergman](#) (R) tweeted Sunday. "I appreciate the decisive action by our fighter pilots. The American people deserve far more answers than we have."

Before Sunday the United States [downed](#) three objects within a week that were believed to be surveillance balloons.

Top Lawmaker Warns US Doesn't Have an 'Adequate Radar System' After Flying Objects Shot Down

The chairman of the House Intelligence Committee warned the United States doesn't have an adequate radar system after multiple incidents involving flying objects in recent days.

"We don't really have adequate radar system, and we certainly don't have an integrated missile defense system. We're going to have to begin to look at the United States airspace as one that we need to defend," Rep. Mike Turner (R-Ohio), the House Intelligence panel's chair, [told](#) CNN's State of the Union on Sunday. "This shows some of the problems and gaps that we have."

Lawmakers have sounded the alarm after a suspected Chinese spy [balloon](#) was spotted over U.S. territory on Feb. 4. While some of them called on the military to shoot it down, the aircraft traveled over much of the continental United States before it was downed by an F-22 Raptor near South Carolina's coast days later.

In the past several days, more incidents were reported by both U.S. and Canadian officials. On Saturday, another F-22 shot down an unknown object near the Yukon Territory, and a day before that, shot down an object in northern Alaska near Prudhoe Bay.

On Saturday evening, the Canadian-U.S.-operated North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) and Federal Aviation Administration shut down airspace in a part of Montana. They later blamed it on a radar anomaly, and the airspace was closed down for a brief period of time.

"They do appear somewhat trigger-happy, although this is certainly preferable to the permissive environment that they showed when the Chinese spy balloon was coming over to our most sensitive sites," Turner said on the Sunday program.

But the top Republican said that he hasn't been briefed on the latest developments around unknown objects being shot down. He described the lack of intelligence and details "particularly annoying," claiming "there needs to be more engagement within the administration and Congress."

"Probably they're a little hesitant after the Chinese balloon fiasco, where they let it go across the country to great criticism—bipartisan, bicameral criticisms from Congress," he continued to say. "I think it's certainly a new, recent development that you have China being so aggressive in entering other country's airspace."

'Much Smaller'

Meanwhile, Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-N.Y.) told a separate news program Sunday that U.S. officials have indicated to him that they believe the recently shot down objects are balloons, although they're not as large as the one that was shot down off the Carolinas.

When asked during an ABC News interview whether those two recent objects were balloons, Schumer responded in the affirmative. "They believe they were, yes, but much smaller than the first one," he said.

Schumer said teams were recovering debris from the objects and would work to determine where they came from. The ones downed on Friday and Saturday were smaller and flying at lower altitudes of about 40,000 feet, within the airspace occupied by commercial flights, compared with about 60,000 feet for the first one.

"The bottom line is until a few months ago we didn't know about these balloons," Schumer said. "It is wild that we didn't know. ... Now they are learning a lot more. And the military and the intelligence are focused like a laser on first gathering and accumulating the information, then coming up with a comprehensive analysis."

Canadian Defense Minister Anita Anand told a news conference in Ottawa that one of the objects, flying at around 40,000 feet, had been shot down at 3:41 p.m. EST, approximately 100 miles from the Canada–U.S. border in the central Yukon. A

recovery operation was underway involving the Canadian Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

Hours later, in the United States, the Federal Aviation Administration said Saturday night it had closed some airspace in Montana to support Defense Department activities. NORAD later said the closure, which lasted a little more than an hour, came after it had detected “a radar anomaly” and sent fighter aircraft to investigate. The aircraft did not identify any object to correlate to the radar hits, NORAD said.

Recovery efforts are also underway near Deadhorse, Alaska, a very remote area located within the Arctic Circle, according to U.S. military officials.

Republicans Raise Concerns After Two Objects Shot Down Over Alaska, Canada

Republicans are raising concerns following actions by the U.S. military to shoot down two objects over Alaska and Canada recently, after a Chinese spy balloon was taken down off the South Carolina coast last week.

“Defending our borders and our national security interests requires military dominance and the political will to utilize that dominance,” Rep. August Pfluger (R-Texas), a former F-22 pilot, [wrote](#) on Twitter in the late evening on Feb. 11.

“As we gather facts about continued airspace intrusions, I urge the Biden Admin to send an unmistakable message to would be violators of sovereignty: the U.S. will take immediate action to defend ourselves against all threats,” Pfluger added.

On Feb. 4, a U.S. F-22 fighter jet [shot down](#) the Chinese spy balloon that had flown over the continental United States for days, including [flying](#) near Malmstrom Air Force Base in Montana and other U.S. military bases.

Another U.S. F-22 fighter jet [shot down](#) a “high-altitude object” off the coast of Alaska on Feb. 10. According to the Pentagon, the object was flying at 40,000 feet before being taken down.

A day later, on Feb. 11, an unidentified cylindrical object was [shot down](#) by a U.S. F-22 in a joint operation with Canada. According to the Canadian government, the object was taken down over Canada’s Yukon territory, which lies east of Alaska.

A separate incident also happened on Feb. 11, when the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) temporarily [closed down](#) some airspace in Montana for U.S. military activities. According to the binational North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD), the airspace restriction was implemented after NORAD “detected a radar anomaly and sent fighter aircraft to investigate.”

However, its aircraft did not identify any object “to correlate to the radar hits.”

“Where is the Biden transparency,” [Kayleigh McEnany](#), a former press secretary during the Trump administration, [wrote](#) on Twitter on Saturday, pointing to U.S. military actions over Canada and Alaska, and temporary closure of some Montana airspace.

“Precisely ZERO answers,” McEnany wrote.

Rep. [Don Bacon](#) (R-Neb.) took to Twitter to say that the United States is “being tested.”

“The third object has now been shot down in a week over U.S. or Canada’s airspace. We’re being tested,” Bacon [wrote](#). “I applaud the President’s quick reaction on the last two. There’s a lot to learn, but defending our sovereignty and keeping our air defenses strong remain our priorities.”

Alaska

Alaska Gov. Mike Dunleavy, a Republican, [issued](#) a statement on Friday following the shooting over Alaskan waters, saying the incident “raises serious national security concerns that should concern every American.”

“This latest intrusion into our airspace raises serious questions about the White House’s decision to not shoot down a Chinese spy balloon last week when it was above the Aleutian Chain and prevent it from flying over important military sites in the Lower-48,” Dunleavy said.

“Unlike other states, Alaska is truly on the front lines. Because of our close proximity to our neighbors there is very little margin for error,” he continued. “Russian territory is only a few miles away. We are the one state closest to the Korean Peninsula and China.”

The Alaska governor ended his statement by saying that there might be similar incursions in the future.

“If the last few days are any indication, this may be the new norm and we must be prepared,” he said.

Sen. Dan Sullivan (R-Alaska) said the U.S. military was working to resolve this “unprecedented challenge,” according to a [statement](#) from his office.

“I once again commend our military, particularly the Active Duty and Guard forces in Alaska, who have literally been working around the clock for weeks tracking and eliminating this unprecedented challenge, including the Alaska-based F-22 that just shot down another unidentified aircraft over Canada,” Sullivan wrote.

Sullivan added, “It’s important that the Biden Administration provide to the American people as much information as possible on these sightings or any similar incidents.”

Canada

Rep. Matt Rosendale (R-Mont.) questioned why the Biden administration could swiftly shoot down aerial objects over Canada and Alaska, but waited for days to take down the Chinese balloon.

“Can the Biden Admin please explain why they shot down two relatively small “objects” over Alaskan and Canadian airspace this week, but allowed a known Chinese Spy balloon to collect and transmit data about our country for a week before it was brought down?” Rosendale [asked](#) on Twitter on Feb. 11.

Sen. Lisa Murkowski (R-Alaska) called for “maximum transparency” after the takedown of the object over Canada, according to a [statement](#).

“I again commend the excellent mission execution by our military men and women from the 11th Air Force and the Alaska Air National Guard, as well as the leadership at Alaska NORAD and NORTHCOM, in taking this object down,” Murkowski wrote.

“As we learn more about these objects, I will continue to encourage maximum transparency so that Alaskans have the greatest possible understanding of what they are and what we are doing, on the front line of our nation’s defense, to take them safely out of the sky.”

Balloons And UFOs: Here's What's Happened, And What We Know

New [UFO](#) sightings appear to be popping up all around the United States over the past few days.

In the week since the U.S. military shot down a suspected Chinese spy balloon off the coast of South Carolina, officials say at least three other strange flying objects have been blasted out of the sky, and there have been multiple additional incidents leading to temporary restrictions in pockets of sky around the Midwest.

In the most recent development, a U.S. F-16 fighter jet shot down a UFO over Lake Huron on Sunday, according to officials. The Defense Department (DOD) said in a statement that President Joe Biden ordered the strike on the recommendation of military leadership after an “airborne object flying at approximately 20,000 feet altitude in U.S. airspace” over the lake, a location chosen for its low impact on people below and the improved odds for debris recovery.

The DOD statement said the object was detected Sunday morning and its altitude raised concerns, “including that it could be a hazard to civilian aviation.” The object “flew in proximity to sensitive DOD sights” and had “potential surveillance capabilities” but likely no “kinetic military threat” the DOD said. A recovery

operation is now expected to take place. Officials said there were no indications of civilians being hurt.

“Today, a high-altitude object was detected in U.S. airspace over Lake Huron. NORAD launched Canadian and U.S. aircraft to investigate and the object was taken down in U.S. airspace by U.S. aircraft. We unequivocally support this action,” tweeted Canadian Defense Minister Anita Anand. “We will continue to work with the U.S. and NORAD to protect North America.”

Hours earlier, Senate Majority Leader [Chuck Schumer](#) (D-NY) told ABC News’s George Stephanopoulos he discussed the situation with National Security Adviser Jake Sullivan the night before, and shared that U.S. officials believe the UFOs shot down after being observed over a remote part of Alaska and Canada were balloons.

These objects were “much smaller” than the balloon shot down over the Atlantic Ocean last weekend, Schumer said, and they were flying at a lower altitude of about 40,000 feet, endangering commercial aircraft.

“I think the Chinese were humiliated. With salvage operations underway, Schumer said U.S. military and intelligence officials are focused on gathering and accumulating information. A “comprehensive analysis” will follow, the senator added.

Pentagon spokesman Brig. Gen. Patrick Ryder said on Friday the UFO shot down over Alaska was “[about the size of a small car](#)” and “not similar in size or shape” to the suspected Chinese surveillance balloon. The Pentagon said recovery teams were deployed to collect debris on top of ice in U.S. territorial waters, [per CNN](#).

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau first announced on Saturday a U.S. Air Force fighter jet shot down a UFO flying [over the Yukon](#). He said Canadian forces would recover and analyze the wreckage of the object [shot down over the Yukon](#). Anand said the UFO appeared to be a “small, cylindrical object.”

Little more information has been formally released through official government channels, and unlike the suspected Chinese spy balloon, there have been no reliable images of the other aircraft that have emerged.

The suspected Chinese spy balloon was much larger than the UFOs that followed and was flying at a higher altitude that apparently did not endanger commercial aircraft, according to U.S. officials. A senior State Department official said the vessel was equipped with “multiple antennas” capable of collecting signals intelligence, [according to NBC News](#).

While concerns have been raised about why the military did not shoot down the balloon sooner as it transited a wide swath of the United States, the Pentagon stressed the danger of falling debris and even the [possibility of the vessel carrying explosives](#).

China claims the vessel was a civilian weather balloon that had been blown off course and [condemned the United States](#) for its decision to shoot the aircraft down.

There have been other potential sightings in the past 24 hours.

North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) detected what it called a “radar anomaly,” leading to a temporary flight restriction over the central part of Montana on Saturday night. But a fighter aircraft sent to investigate “did not

identify any object to correlate” the radar hits and the restriction was lifted, NORAD said.

“I am in constant communication with NORCOM and they have just advised me that they have confidence there IS an object and it WAS NOT an anomaly,” tweeted Rep. Matt Rosendale (R-MT) on Sunday. “I am waiting now to receive visual confirmation. Our nation’s security is my priority.”

Also on Sunday, the Federal Aviation Administration [temporarily closed](#) a section of airspace mostly over northern Lake Michigan in support of a national defense situation.

It appears the temporary air restriction over Lake Michigan was connected to the object shot down over Lake Huron to the east on the other side of the state of Michigan. “Based on its flight path and data we can reasonably connect this object to the radar signal picked up over Montana,” DOD’s Sunday statement said.

Rep. Jack Bergman (R-MT) appeared on Fox News and said he was told by the Defense Department that the UFO shot down over Lake Huron appears to have had an octagonal structure. That matches a tweet by [Edward Wong](#), a [diplomatic correspondent](#) for The New York Times, who said U.S. officials revealed the object appeared as “an octagonal structure with strings hanging off but no discernible payload.”

Sightings in other parts of the world were also reported Sunday. Authorities in China said they witnessed a UFO off the [coast of a port city](#), a state-run newspaper claimed. There were also reports that Uruguay's Air Force was investigating "[flashing lights in the sky](#)."

During his interview on ABC's "This Week," Schumer claimed the United States only discovered such flying objects dating back to the Trump administration within the past few months. Indeed, new reports have divulged intelligence about sightings of high-altitude balloons believed to be from China around places [such as Florida and Hawaii](#).

"It is wild that we didn't know," Schumer said. He added later: "Now they are learning a lot more. And the military and the intelligence are focused like a laser on first gathering and accumulating the information, then coming up with a comprehensive analysis."

Astronomers Say Chinese Satellite Beamed Green Lasers Over Hawaii

Astronomers believe the green laser beams spotted over the Hawaiian Islands last month came from a Chinese satellite.

The National Astronomical Observatory of Japan (NAOJ) said in a January 30 tweet that the space agency's Subaru-Asahi Star Camera on Mauna Kea on the Big Island of Hawaii captured green laser lights in the cloudy sky over Maunakea, Hawai'i.

Although the agency initially believed the lights came from a NASA remote-sensing altimeter satellite known as an ICESAT-2/43613, which [CNET](#) described as NASA's Ice, Cloud, and Land Elevation Satellite-2 that shoots lasers at Earth to measure the surface of the planet.

Officials corrected the original statement on February 6, saying NASA scientists "did a simulation of the trajectory of satellites that have a similar instrument and found a most likely candidate as the ACDL instrument by the Chinese Daqi-1/AEMS satellite."

"We really appreciate their efforts in the identification of the light," NAOJ wrote. "We are sorry about our confusion related to this event and its potential impact on the ICESat-2 team."

The University of Hawaii, Institute of Astronomy's Roy Gal told [KHON2](#) the beams came from a Chinese satellite that measures pollutants, "among other things."

"It has many different instruments on it ... Some kind of topographical mapping or they're also used for measuring stuff in Earth's atmosphere, and I think that's what it is, environmental measurement satellite."

Gal added the U.S. has satellites performing the same tasks.

Still, China's spacecraft does not pose a risk to the islands or locals as tensions between the U.S. and China rise amid spy satellites and other devices owned by the Chinese regime entering U.S. air space, which has prompted the deployment of U.S. military fighter jets several times to strike down the objects.

"No, it's not a risk to Hawaii or anyplace else, too," Gal said. "We have aircraft making these measurements all the time. If you've seen topographical maps with high precision, those are made using sometimes this kind of thing."

Ray L'Heureux, a former chief of staff of Marine Forces Pacific, told the news outlet aired a different opinion surrounding the laser beams.

"I'm not sure, and this is my opinion, why the Chinese — who are probably some of the most prolific polluters on the planet — would be collecting data on pollutants on this side of the Pacific," L'Heureux said.

L'Heureux noted that due to the tensions between the U.S. and China, "people are a little antsy, and I think we just need to be a little bit more aware, vigilant."

U.S. Temporarily Closed Airspace Over Northern Michigan For National Defense Situation; Reopened After Short Time

The U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) temporarily closed a section of airspace in northern Michigan on Sunday in support of a national defense situation.

The closed airspace, which was designated as “national defense airspace,” was mostly located over the northern part of Lake Michigan.

The North American Aerospace Defense Command and U.S. Northern Command released a statement saying that the temporary flight restriction was put in place “to ensure the safety of air traffic in the area during NORAD operations.”

Shortly after this report was published, the FAA canceled the restrictions and reopened the airspace.

The situation comes after the U.S. military shot down an unidentified flying object over Alaska on Friday and another over Canada on Saturday.

The FAA sent the same alert out on Saturday night designating an area in the northern part of Montana as a “national defense airspace,” saying and that anyone who entered the airspace would be intercepted.

The North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) and the U.S. Northern Command released a statement late on Saturday night about the incident over Montana.

“NORAD detected a radar anomaly and sent fighter aircraft to investigate,” that statement said. “Those aircraft did not identify any object to correlate to the radar hits. NORAD will continue to monitor the situation.”

Rep. Matt Rosendale (R-MT) said in a tweet Sunday afternoon that he was informed that there was an object in Montana airspace and that it was not “an anomaly.”

“I am in constant communication with NORCOM and they have just advised me that they have confidence there IS an object and it WAS NOT an anomaly,” he said. “I am waiting now to receive visual confirmation. Our nation’s security is my priority.”

[Fear and 'Crisis:' We've Been Repeatedly Warned!](#)

In [my last post](#), I explained a bit of the history behind the idea of using a 'crisis' to manipulate free people into willingly giving up their rights and liberties for the perception of safety. In this post, I am going to detail just a small bit of the evidence that shows that credible people have been trying to warn us about the existence of people who use fear to control for decades.

The first thing we need to understand is that there isn't a single group of people working behind the scenes to take control of free people. There are a series of different groups. They work together, but they compete with each other. In general terms, it is about proving to each other which one of them is the best and smartest by competing to see which group can be the most effective in taking over the most power. This is why, if you only look at current events with a casual eye, everything seems to be the work of random events, or, at worse, incompetence. Make no mistake: *this is by design!* There is a concerted effort to seize control of all free nations, and the people working toward that end are in a race with each of the various factions within the greater cabal. The apparent chaos that results works to their benefit, and they know it. In fact, they count on it.

For the purpose of this post, I am going to focus on just one of these different groups struggling to take control. In this case, I am going to highlight what has been called, "the military industrial process." We will start with some sworn testimony about which I suspect you have never heard a single thing. We are going to look at the testimony of Dr. Carol Rosin and the dying story of one Werner von Braun (*the father of the NAZI and U.S. space programs*).

Dr. Rosin met von Braun in the mid 1970's, when he was dying of cancer. He wanted her to help him stop the militarization of space for the purposes of controlling the world. He told her that the people working to militarize space were going to use fear to achieve their goals, and that they would identify a series of 'threats' in the process. First, it would be the Russians, then terrorism, then rogue nations, followed by asteroids and, finally, the final 'threat' would be aliens. But von Braun stressed to Dr. Rosin that this would all be lies.

What was most interesting to me was a repetitive sentence that he said to me over and over again during the approximately four years that I had the opportunity to work with him. He said the strategy that was being used to educate the public and decision makers was to use scare tactics... That was how we identify an enemy.

*The strategy that Wernher Von Braun taught me was that **first the Russians are going to be considered to be the enemy.*** In fact, in 1974, they were the enemy, the identified enemy. We were told that they had “killer satellites”. We were told that they were coming to get us and control us – that they were “Commies.”*

Then terrorists would be identified, and that was soon to follow. We heard a lot about terrorism. Then we were going to identify third-world country “crazies.” We now call them Nations of Concern. But he said that would be the third enemy against whom we would build space-based weapons.

The next enemy was asteroids. Now, at this point he kind of chuckled the first time he said it. Asteroids- against asteroids we are going to build space-based weapons.

*And the funniest one of all was what he called aliens, extraterrestrials. That would be the final scare. And over and over and over during the four years that I knew him and was giving speeches for him, he would bring up that last card. “And remember Carol, the last card is the alien card. We are going to have to build space-based weapons against aliens **and all of it is a lie.**”*

Dr. Rosin said she was convinced that von Braun knew soothing he would not discuss, and that it scared him. What he told her was all he was willing to say — even as he knew he was dying. Still, as fanciful as von Braun’s claims may seem, we have — as a matter of fact — been told that the Russians, terrorists, rogue nations and asteroids are all threats to our continued existence. And, for those who do not remember, in the months leading up to the COVID-19 ‘crisis,’ there were many serious stories and supposed ‘admissions’ by the government about the factual existence of ‘UFO’s.’ SO, whether you believe von Braun and Dr. Rosin or not, we have been told to fear every one of the things she identified back in the mid 1970’s, and they came roughly in the order she predicted. Now, hold on to that while you consider this next piece of the puzzle.

General Smedley Butler, USMC and two-time winner of the Congressional Medal of Honor, warned us that “[War is a Racket](#)” way back in 1935. What Gen. Butler was trying to warn us about is that there are people working behind the scenes to use wars as a way to not only profit, but also to control the world. WW I was started by these people so they could re-set the failing global financial system, as well as re-draw the national borders of many ancient nations. Both of these goals were achieved as a result of the war. Now, hold on to the Gen. Butler’s and von Braun’s warnings and consider this next warning, from President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

OK, so, what does all of this give us? Well, for one thing, we have a warning about the use of war and the military to control the world. We are also told that they will use false flags or ‘fear’ to help them achieve their goals more easily by creating a panic in the population which, in turn, will convince the people they must do what the people who seek to control them say they need to do. Finally, all three of these warnings come from the most serious and respectable of men (*even though he was a NAZI, von Braun is one of the most significant figures in the history of the Twentieth Century*).

Now, understand, the military industrial complex is just one group among several that is seeking to control the world. In fact, it would be much more accurate to say that military and martial fears is just one way that those who seek to control us scare us into surrendering to their will. There are others who use different fears. Climate change is one of those scare tactics, as well as a host of other environmental threats. The Ozone hole, acid rain, deforestation and other ‘threats’ fall under this general banner of environmental threats. They also use political ‘threats,’ but these are designed to not only scare us, but to also separate us from our fellow countrymen. Finally, we have Racism and Political Correctness, but these are used not so much to cause fear as they are hammers used to force those who refuse to be scared to bow to the agenda being pushed on them.

Here is the point: The use of fear to scare people into surrendering their rights and liberties to would-be tyrants is very real, and serious, respectable people have been trying to warn us about it for decades. The problem is, you either do not know about them and their warnings, or, if you have heard about them and their warnings, you have believed the people trying to control you when they tell you

those people trying to warn you are 'conspiracy theorists' (*another intentional program used to protect the tyrants' agenda by disguising and confusing people*).

** NOTE: In the case of 'Communism' being used as a 'threat,' this is a case where the truth actually worked in the favor of those who are trying to take over the world. Only, in this case, it is probably because a great many of those people are also aligned with or even part of the Communist agenda.*
